



IN.TUNE CALL FOR COLLABORATIVE TEACHER-LED PROJECTS

First Edition – 2026

Strengthening cooperation between partner institutions is a core strategic objective of the IN.TUNE Alliance. Teachers play a central role in advancing internationalisation, mobility, and innovation in teaching and learning. Their sustained cross-border collaboration contributes to curriculum development, pedagogical innovation, and a shared institutional culture of openness and trust.

This call supports initiatives by teachers that foster long-term cooperation between departments, promote mobility, and integrate international perspectives into regular teaching formats. By encouraging structured peer exchange and the use of digital and blended learning tools, the call contributes to the Alliance's objectives in mobility, curriculum innovation, language development, and digital transformation.

Call for Projects

The IN.TUNE Alliance seeks joint projects that **bring together teachers and/or departments from a minimum of four partner institutions** in order to:

- **Strengthen sustainable cooperation** between teachers and/or departments at IN.TUNE partner institutions through *peer exchange, mutual observation, and collaboration formats*
- **Develop and implement joint teaching and learning activities** that *foster innovative pedagogical, artistic, and methodological approaches*
- Promote language development for staff by creating opportunities for informal and professional exchange within an international teaching environment
- **Expand mobility opportunities for teachers and students**, which can lead to blended mobility formats – combining virtual collaboration with a shorter physical mobility period - (and short-term formats connected to joint teaching activities)
- **Integrate and further develop digital and distance learning tools** to **enhance curricula and provide continuous international learning experiences** across degree programmes

Who can apply?

The call is open to teachers from all disciplines and teaching levels at IN.TUNE partner institutions. Priority will be given to proposals involving one-to-one teaching and other forms of main discipline instruction, as well as to projects that connect multiple IN.TUNE partner institutions across the Alliance. If any assistance is needed to get in touch with fellow teachers in the same discipline or field, please contact the IN.TUNE representatives (contact details will be provided at the end of the document). Please consult your supervisor or head

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of department to confirm whether submitting a project is possible. Please note that no additional teaching remuneration is available for carrying out the project.

Budget

Grant amount: EUR 2 000 – 5 000 per project

The budget can be used for, for example, travel expenses, teaching materials, and similar costs.

Combination with other funding sources

Alliance funding may be combined with Erasmus+ teaching mobility (STA), staff training mobility (STT), or institutional funding, where available, only if double funding is strictly avoided. The same activity or cost item may not be financed from more than one funding source.

Where different funding sources are combined, alliance funds must be used for separate and clearly identifiable project activities or expenditures.

Selection

The selection will be made by representatives from all IN.TUNE partner institutions after internal consultation. The selection is based on the relevance of the objectives of the call, the innovativeness of the proposed activities, and their potential to strengthen sustainable collaboration between IN.TUNE partner institutions. Evaluation will also consider the feasibility and clarity of the project plan, the expected impact on student and staff mobility,

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and the project's contribution to language development in international teaching contexts.

Reporting

Funded projects are required to submit both an impact report and a financial report at the end of the approved project period.
